Getting to Know You

One of motorsports' most popular and experienced pilots, Jan Magnussen's 15th season with Corvette Racing was another championship-winning one. He teamed with Antonio Garcia for consecutive IMSA GTLM Driver Championships – the Dane's third in his career with Corvette Racing and second straight with his long-time teammate. A true legend in his native Denmark, Magnussen has won races and titles in machines ranging from single-seaters to touring cars around the world. His daredevil driving style and take-no-prisoners mentality make him just as popular with Corvette Nation. Of Magnussen's 35 wins with Corvette Racing, 13 have come with Garcia including Sebring, COTA and VIR in 2017. The pairing won overall in 2016 at VIR. Magnussen, a former F1 driver, joined Corvette Racing for long-distance events in 2004, and became a full-season driver in 2007. He was ALMS GT1 co-champion with Johnny O'Connell in 2008, and captured the GT championship with Garcia in 2013.

- 2006: 24 Hours of Le Mans GT1 winner, Sebring 12-hour winner (Corvette C6.R, Gavin and Beretta co-drivers). Also competed in the Rolex Series (Pontiac GTO.R and Daytona Prototype) and Danish Touring Car series.
- 2007: First season as full-time driver for Corvette Racing. Teamed with Johnny O'Connell, won three races (Houston, Mosport, Detroit) and four poles. Ran fastest race lap at six events. Second in GT1 in 24 Hours of Le Mans.
- 2008: Won ALMS GT1 championship (with O'Connell) for first time; eight ALMS victories (including Sebring 12 Hours and 1,000-mile Petit Le Mans) and four fast qualifiers; runner-up in GT1 class at 24 Hours of Le Mans for second consecutive year. Won Danish Touring Car Series championship.
- 2009: Won GT1 in 24 Hours of Le Mans fourth time, won class at Sebring third time; finished second at Mid-Ohio in race debut for GT2 Corvette C6.R; took first GT2 win for Corvette Racing in GT2 at Mosport.
- 2010: Won 1,000-mile Petit Le Mans with co-drivers Oliver Gavin and Emmanuel Collard. Podium finishes at Long Beach and Salt Lake City, and fastest race lap at Mosport.
- 2011: Won Grand Prix of Mosport in ALMS. Finished second in GT driver championship with co-driver Gavin after runner-up finishes at Long Beach and Mid-Ohio, and third-place finish in inaugural Baltimore street race; ran fastest laps in Long Beach and Baltimore.
- 2012: Teamed with Antonio Garcia for the full ALMS season and placed third in GT championship. Pairing posted five runner-up finishes (four in the first five events). Took pole position at Sebring and Canadian Tire Motorsport Park and set the fastest GT race lap at Road America.
- 2013: GT co-champion with Antonio Garcia in No. 3 Compuware Corvette C6.R. Scored victories at Laguna Seca, Baltimore and Circuit of The Americas. Three wins were more than any other pairing in GT class. Also voted ALMS Most Popular Driver for second time in three seasons. Placed fourth in GTE Pro class at Le Mans with Garcia and Jordan Taylor.
- 2014: Full season in TUDOR United SportsCar Championship with Antonio Garcia. Won four consecutive TUDOR races: Long Beach, Laguna Seca, Watkins Glen and Canadian Tire Motorsport Park. Runner-up at Le Mans with Garcia/Jordan Taylor. Pole winner at Long Beach.
- 2015: Opened TUDOR Championship season with GTLM victory in Rolex 24 with Antonio Garcia, Ryan Briscoe; trio followed with win at Sebring. Third at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park with Garcia.
- 2016: Overall race winner and pole-sitter at VIR with Garcia. Runner-up at Daytona and Lime Rock in No. 3 Corvette. Pairing finished third in GTLM points.
- 2017: Won GTLM Driver Championship with Garcia for third career IMSA title. Winner at Sebring for fifth time in career; drove with Garcia/Mike Rockenfeller. Won with Garcia at COTA and VIR. Pole-winner at Long Beach in GTLM. Third at Le Mans with Garcia/Jordan Taylor. Never finished outside top-five in any race.
- 2018: Repeated with Antonio Garcia as IMSA GTLM Champion on strength of eight podiums in 11 races. Third at Daytona with Garcia/Mike Rockenfeller and captured pole position; fourth at Le Mans
- 2019: Second at Long Beach, Mid-Ohio and Watkins Glen in No. 3 Corvette w/ Antonio Garcia; third at Sebring in WeatherTech GTLM race w/ Garcia/Mike Rockenfeller; trio also drove No. 63 Corvette in FIA WEC race. Made 150th Corvette Racing start at Watkins Glen.

Career Download

Starting his racing career in karts, Magnussen captured numerous national titles before winning the junior World Karting championship in 1987-89 and the Formula K world title in 1990. He began a successful stint in single-seaters, winning the prestigious Formula Ford Festival at Brands Hatch in 1992. In 1994, Magnussen captured 14 wins in 18 races for Paul Stewart Racing en route to winning the British Formula 3 championship, beating Ayrton Senna's record for most wins in one season. He also served as a Formula 1 test driver for McLaren before competing in the DTM and ITC touring car championships in 1995-96, finishing second in ITC in 1995. In 1997, Magnussen joined Formula 1 full-time with the Stewart Grand Prix team, highlighted by a career-best sixth place in Montreal in 1998.

Magnussen joined the Panoz factory sports car effort in 1999. He captured six wins in the American-built prototype and established himself as a star in the nascent American Le Mans Series. He was part of the 2003 Corvette-Ferrari rivalry in the ALMS as part of the Prodrive lineup. The next year, he joined Corvette Racing.

A fan favorite, Magnussen won the "Most Popular Driver" in 2001, 2003, 2011 and 2013. His son, Kevin, was named as part of McLaren's Formula One team in late 2013 after winning the Formula Renault 3.5 championship with five victories. He joined the Haas F1 team for 2017 after racing for the Renault factory team in 2016.
