Getting to Know You

Marcel Fässler is one of the most accomplished sports car drivers of his generation with championships and race wins in both prototype and GT cars. The Swiss driver is in his fifth consecutive season with Corvette Racing – his sixth overall. After driving for the team in 2009, Fässler returned in 2016 as an endurance teammate to Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner. He is a three-time winner at the 24 Hours of Le Mans and a past FIA WEC World Champion. He also is a past champion of the Spa 24 Hours driving a Corvette.

Career Highlights

- Early career: Karting for nine years then moved up to French Formula Renault (1996 Rookie of the Year) and French F3 championships. Second in 1999 German F3 Championship. DTM from 2000-2005 with five victories; third in 2003 championship.
- 2006: Runner-up in Spa 24 Hours; made first start at Le Mans 24 Hours.
- 2007: Winner in Spa 24 Hours; A1 Team Switzerland in A1GP.
- 2008: Two ALMS races in P1 class for Audi; fourth in FIA GT Championship.
- 2009: Three events for Corvette Racing – second at Sebring, fourth at Petit Le Mans and retired from lead at Le Mans after 22 hours; champion of International GT Open.
- 2010: Runner-up in P1 class at Le Mans.
- 2011: Overall winner at Le Mans and Intercontinental Le Mans Cup champion.
- 2012: Scored second overall win at Le Mans and won FIA WEC World Championship; also won at Silverstone and Bahrain.
- 2013: Overall winner at Sebring for first time; runner-up in FIA WEC points; won WEC rounds at Spa, Brazil and China; fifth at Le Mans
- 2014: Third overall win at Le Mans and second in FIA WEC points.
- 2015: Third-place overall at Le Mans
- 2016: Returned to Corvette Racing for endurance rounds in IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship; won Rolex 24 and Sebring 12 Hours with Oliver Gavin/Tommy Milner; third place in GTLM at Petit Le Mans; fourth place at Le Mans 24 Hours.

- 2017: Named to Corvette Racing lineup for Daytona, Sebring and Le Mans; also driving at Nurburgring 24 and Blancpain GT Series Sprint Cup (Team WRT). Eighth at Le Mans with Gavin/Milner.
- 2018: Fourth at Daytona with Oliver Gavin/Tommy Milner.
- 2019: Suffered unfortunate crash in sixth hour at Le Mans. Filled in for injured Tommy Milner at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park and Lime Rock Park.
- 2020: Seventh in class at Daytona with Oliver Gavin/Tommy Milner after lengthy stop for mechanical repairs. Fourth in GTLM at Petit Le Mans.

Well-rounded career with massive experience in multiple forms of motorsport. First major professional experience came in DTM from 2000-05. Drove for works Mercedes program from 2000-03; fourth in

championship points from 2000-02 and third in 2003 championship. First season saw three runner-up positions and a like number of third-place finishes.

Took first career victories in 2001 at Oschersleben; pole in both races and fastest race lap in Race One. Also second at Hockenheimring and EuroSpeedway Lausitz. Two more wins in 2002 (A1 Ring and Zandvoort). Won at A1 Ring again in 2003; second Hockenheimring, Nurburgring and Norisring; and third at second Hockenheimring race. Pole positions at Adria, Nurburgring and A1 Ring.
