Getting to Know You

Oliver Gavin is the most successful and longest-serving driver in Corvette Racing history having joined the team in 2002. With 51 victories and five championships as part the program, Gavin also ranks as one of the most accomplished drivers in IMSA history. His Corvette Racing record includes wins at Le Mans, Daytona, Sebring and Petit Le Mans. In his 19th season with Corvette Racing, Gavin will team with Tommy Milner in the No. 4 Corvette C8.R for the full season. Gavin has won two championships with Milner (2012 and 2016) in their seven previous seasons together, and they are the longest-running driver pairing currently in IMSA.

- 2002: GTS winner in 24 Hours of Le Mans, two ALMS wins with Corvette Racing (Sebring, Atlanta).
- 2003: Two ALMS wins with Corvette Racing (Atlanta, Trois-Rivieres), third in Driver's championship.
- 2004: GTS winner in 24 Hours of Le Mans, four ALMS wins (Lime Rock, Mosport, Elkhart Lake, Atlanta) with Corvette C5-R.
- 2005: ALMS GT1 co-champion, six wins; GT1 winner, 24 Hours of Le Mans (Corvette C6.R).
- 2006: ALMS GT1 co-champion, five wins; GT1 winner, 24 Hours of Le Mans and Sebring 12-hour (Corvette C6.R).

- 2007: ALMS GT1 co-champion, nine wins (tied ALMS single-season record); GT1 winner at Sebring 12-hour and Petit Le Mans (Corvette C6.R); four poles and three fastest race laps.
- 2008: Second in ALMS GT1 drivers championship with three victories; runner-up in GT1 class at 24 Hours of Le Mans; two poles and five fastest race laps; finished in London Marathon.
- 2009: Won final race for Corvette C6.R in ALMS GT1 at Long Beach, Calif.; was leading GT1 class at 24 Hours of Le Mans at 22-hour mark before mechanical problem caused retirement; finished fourth in Corvette Racing's GT2 debut at Mid-Ohio and third at Mosport.
- 2010: Fastest qualifier in GT2 at 24 Hours of Le Mans, leading race after spirited duel with Risi Ferrari before teammate Collard was forced off track; ran fastest race lap after crew repaired car. Won Petit Le Mans season finale with dramatic last-lap pass after class-leading Ferrari ran out of fuel. Podium finishes at Laguna Seca, Mid-Ohio, and Road America (where Gavin won the GT2 pole) highlighted the season.
- 2011: Won Grand Prix of Mosport with teammate Jan Magnussen, extending his streak of winning at least one ALMS event to 11 years. Finished second in GT driver championship with Magnussen after runner-up finishes at Long Beach and Mid-Ohio and third-place finish in inaugural Baltimore street race.
- 2012: Won fourth ALMS championship. Four wins with Tommy Milner – Long Beach, Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca, Mid-Ohio, VIR. Fastest GT qualifier at Baltimore and set fastest class race lap at Monterey and Baltimore. Sixth at Le Mans after leading near halfway point before No. 4 lost left-rear wheel.
- 2013: Third with Milner in ALMS GT championship. Began title defense with class victory at Sebring alongside Milner and Richard Westbrook. Posted fastest GT lap at Long Beach. Also won at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park.
- 2014: Full season in TUDOR United SportsCar Championship with Tommy Milner. Third at Long Beach. Fourth at Le Mans with Milner and Richard Westbrook.
- 2015: Won at Le Mans for the fifth time and first in GTE Pro. Drove with Tommy Milner/Jordan Taylor and drove the final stint of the race. Third at Daytona with Milner/Simon Pagenaud and was fastest GTLM qualifier. Pole and third at Petit Le Mans to close season.
- 2016: Won first WeatherTech GTLM Driver's Championship and fifth title with Corvette Racing. Won four times with Tommy Milner including thriller at Daytona; finished race just 0.034 seconds clear of teammate Antonio Garcia. Followed with win at Sebring for sixth career win in 12 Hours. Won back-to-back races at Lime Rock (100th win for Corvette Racing) and Road America. Second at Long Beach and Canadian Tire Motorsport Park. Set fastest race lap at VIR.
- 2017: Won with Tommy Milner in GTLM at Long Beach. Eighth at Le Mans with Milner/Fässler.
- 2018: Won at Long Beach with Tommy Milner for 50th career victory as part of Corvette Racing. Second to close 2018 at Petit Le Mans with Milner and Marcel Fässler. Third with Milner at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park. GTLM pole position at Laguna Seca.
- 2019: Third at Long Beach in No. 4 Corvette with Tommy Milner. GTLM pole position and fastest race lap at Road America.
- 2020: Won at Sebring in July with Tommy Milner; part of first 1-2 class finish for Corvette C8.R. Second at Road America and Road Atlanta Six Hours. Recorded first pole position for Corvette C8.R at Daytona in July; seventh in class at Daytona with Milner/Marcel Fässler after lengthy stop for mechanical repairs.

Career Download

Recognized as one of the world's brightest talents in sports car competition, Gavin has an impressive resume of victories and track records. He began his racing career in karting in the '80s, competing in British national series. In 1990, Gavin moved up to single-seaters and promptly won the British National Formula First Series in 1991, scoring 11 wins in 12 races. This remarkable season earned Gavin the prestigious McLaren Autosport Young Driver of the Year award. The following year he finished second in the British Formula Vauxhall Championship. In 1993, Gavin moved up to the highly regarded British Formula 3 Championship and finished as runner-up in the drivers championship.

In 1994, Gavin competed in the FIA International F3000 championship. Returning to British Formula 3 in 1995, he dominated the series with six victories and won the championship while also working as a test driver for the Pacific Formula 1 team. In the late '90s Gavin competed in the International Touring Car series as a factory Opel driver while also working as a Formula 1 test driver for Benetton and Renault (1997-2005) and driving the safety car during the Formula 1 season. When not racing, Gavin competes in marathon, biathlon and triathlon events. He resides in Yardley Hastings, Northampton, with his wife, Helen, and children Lily, Isaac and Fergus.
